

Every person is unique - and their treatment plan should be too. Our staff of clinicians and counselors provide guidance on substance use disorder (SUD), information about how to access naloxone, biopsychosocial screenings and assessments, and linkage to treatment and support resources. Making the call is an important first step. Each individual should be evaluated by a licensed clinician to be sure that the treatment plan is designed to meet individual needs and follows clinical best practices.

The telehealth service of the Addiction Resource Center (ARC) helps patients and families navigate substance use disorder by meeting people where they are. We provide hope, empowerment, and connection to licensed clinicians. We are not affiliated with any treatment centers or providers.

- 1** Take the time to fully understand the caller's situation before guiding them towards the next steps most helpful to them.
- 2** Educate callers on appropriate addiction treatment options and types of providers.
- 3** Assist in arranging a face-to-face clinical evaluation by a trusted, licensed substance use provider – usually within 24 hours.

PATIENT PORTAL

Intervening as early as possible when you or a loved one is struggling with substance use greatly increases the likelihood of recovery. The Addiction Resource Center (ARC) provides tools to help patients and families in crisis, including information about finding treatment, how to help a loved one engage in treatment, how to talk to a doctor, and getting an assessment.

The ARC offers patients an initial self-assessment for drug or alcohol use to gauge risk level for a substance use disorder, and an action plan to present to a primary care provider or an addiction treatment specialist. Visitors can find nearby treatment providers by searching the comprehensive database or calling the ARC line at 1-833-301-HELP (4357).
